

Plot to Blow Up L. A. Court Bared, Declares Judge

Nitroglycerine, Found in County Jail, Intended for Use by Slayers of Policemen, Belief.

Los Angeles, May 27.—Nitroglycerine, discovered in the Los Angeles county jail here yesterday was believed today by sheriff's deputies to have been an adjunct to alleged plans to deliver four convicted slayers of policemen and by Judge Parkers, who heard the trials, to have been designed to blow up his court room.

The four prisoners, William Bringhurst, Willard Thompson, Calvin Rowell and James Wheaton, were said by a fellow prisoner to have sent to gangster friends in Texas a request that they come here and assist in a jail delivery or to effect their release by holding up the train by which they would be taken to the state penitentiary.

Judge Parkers said he was convinced from his own investigations that the slayers had planned to take the explosives into court and probably take toll of life and property. Wheaton and Rowell have been sentenced to life imprisonment. Bringhurst and Thompson will be sentenced Monday.

Bandits Rob Capitalist.
San Francisco, May 27.—Five motor bandits robbed Arthur J. Herbst, retired capitalist of Hillsborough, and Mrs. Herbst of cash, jewelry and furs valued at \$25,000 early this morning as they were returning from San Francisco to their home.

Mrs. Herbst was partially undressed and rolled on the ground by the bandits in their search.

Soderman was found guilty of manslaughter in connection with the killing of Jay Clay Powers, prominent hotel owner, actor and playwright, by a jury in criminal district court here last night and sentenced to five years in the penitentiary. The jury rendered its verdict at 10:30, after having been out four hours and 45 minutes.

Father of Slain Girl Kills Negro Suspect
Waco, Tex., May 27.—Excitement and disorder incident to the killing and burning of Jesse Thomas, 23, here late yesterday virtually had ceased today after one of the

wildest days in the city's history. The day's events began early yesterday when the killing of W. Harrell Bolton, 25, and an attack on Mrs. Margaret Hays, 26, by a negro became known and culminated with the dragging of the supposed guilty negro's charred body through the streets after he had met death at the hands of the woman's father.

Waco officers, reinforced by state rangers, guarded the McLennan county jail all night to protect five negro inmates under sentence for murder. A mob surrounded the structure, but had dwindled considerably early today.

It is believed charges will be filed against Sam Harris, who avenged the crime against his daughter when he shot Thomas after the negro had been identified by Mrs. Hays as her assailant.

Borah Says Anti-Lynching Measure Unconstitutional
Washington, May 27.—The anti-lynching bill recently passed by the house, is "clearly unconstitutional

and it would be futile to attempt to place it on the statute books." Senator Borah, Idaho, yesterday informed the Association of Negro Press of Chicago, in response to a plea for action.

The senator stated in his telegram, however, that the committee would exhaust every effort to devise legislation to meet the lynching problem.
