

**Man Identified  
as One of 2-Gun  
Grocery Bandits**

**Prisoner, Arrested After Being Shot by Housekeeper, Held for Trial on \$10,000 Bond.**

"Fred" Horace Kutch, 2424 Cum-  
ing street, was identified in Central  
police court yesterday as one of  
three masked two-gun grocery band-  
its who held up a store February  
7 and departed leaving "Our compli-  
ments to Chief of Police Dempsey."  
Charles Hendricks, owner of the  
grocery, Sixty-fifth and Shirley

streets, testified he was positive  
Kutch was one of the men, and  
Judge Wappich held the prisoner  
for trial under \$10,000 bond.  
Kutch offered an unsupported  
alibi.  
George Evans, white-haired em-  
ployee at Ak-Sar-Ben field, testified  
the bandits knocked him down, took  
a few cents, then bowed and one  
said, "Kindly present our regards  
to Chief of Police Dempsey."  
Fred (Lone Star) Hans, third  
victim in the robbery, also identi-  
fied Kutch.  
Kutch was arrested last week  
after Nell McNeill, his housekeeper,  
shot him in the thigh at the  
California bar. She later told  
police that Kutch brought home loot  
the night of the Hendricks' robbery,  
burned the papers obtained, and  
talked freely of the crime. Her  
story was reiterated in court.  
The three prisoners, each carry-  
ing two pistols, got \$181.60 and a  
watch from the three victims.

**Auto Crash Victim  
Dies in Hospital**

**Magnus F. Matzen Succumbs  
to Injuries Received When  
Train Hit Car.**

Magnus F. Matzen, farmer, 50,  
brother of John Matzen, state super-  
intendent of schools, died yesterday  
in the Methodist hospital of injuries  
received when his automobile was  
struck by a Northwestern passenger  
train on the outskirts of Hooper,  
Neb., Monday morning at 10:30.  
The car was hurled 50 feet and  
Matzen was thrown 30 feet beyond  
the auto by the force of the collision.  
The train was stopped and backed  
up to the station to switch for an-  
other oncoming passenger train.

Omaha to accompany the body to  
Hooper where funeral services will  
be held Friday afternoon at 2. Burial  
will be in the Hooper cemetery where

ters, Mrs. P. Simonson of Hooper  
and Mrs. Carl J. Hahn of Twin Falls,  
Idaho.

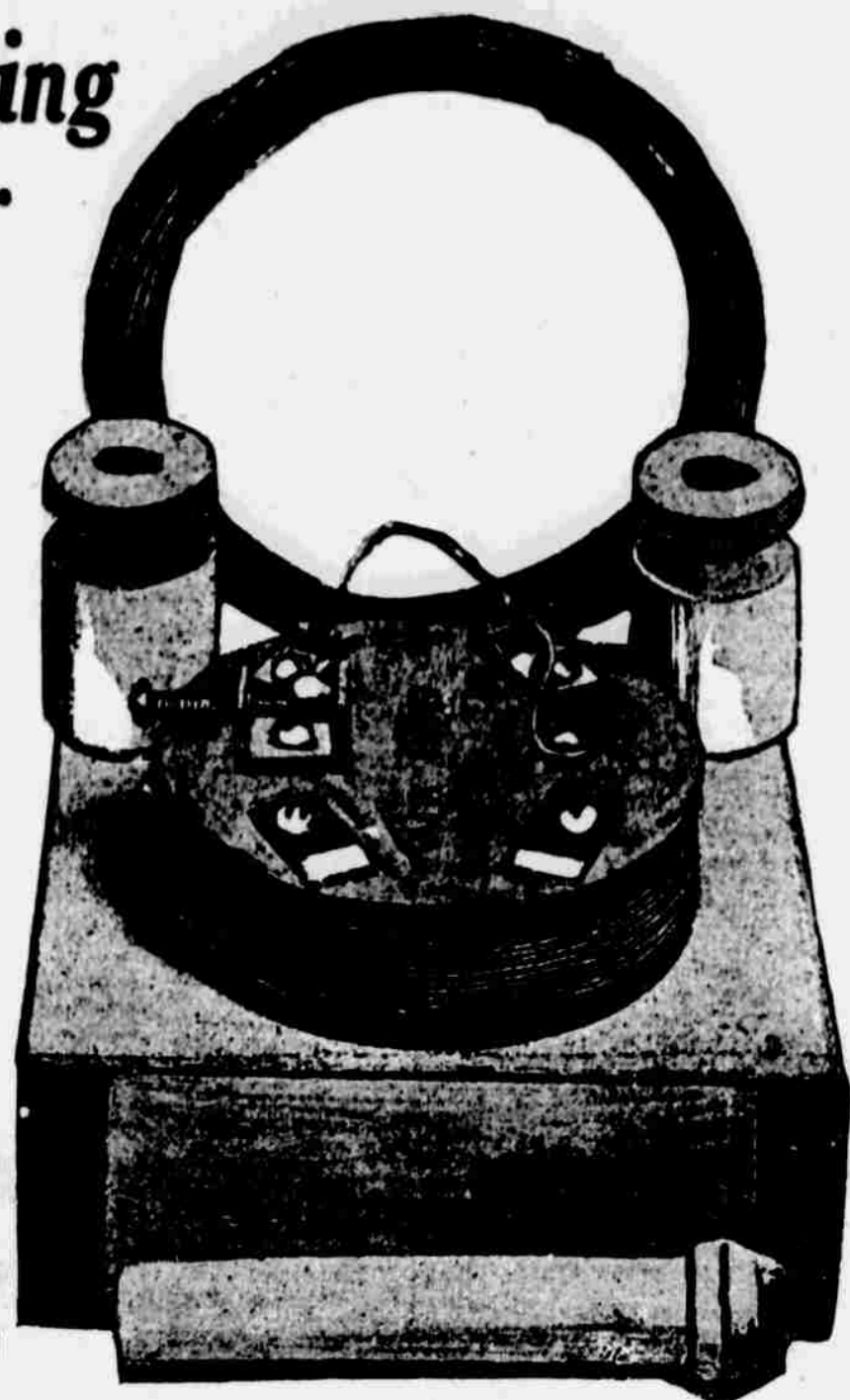
