The atatement made in last week's Courier was rach and partially incorrect. It was corrected in the proof, but the compoaitor did not heed the correction. Mr. Hawkins published her first book, "A Man of Mark," in 1889 at his own expense, and impoverished him. self thereby. From that time until the suecese of "The Prisoner of Zenda," Mr. Hope's life was by no means all roses. At this time he looked on the bar as his career in life, and, far from thinking of literature as a profeasion, he simply wrote for amueement. "Father Stafiford," published in 1890, was his second book, aleo a financial failure; then followed the writing of short atories for the St. James Gazatte, several of which were republiehed in the volume entitled "Sport Royal", "Mr. Witt's Widow," published in 1882, was more succesatul; "A Change of Air" und "Half a Hero" were published the following year. "Half a Hero," by the way, has juet been reiesued by Harper's in a new edition. Then he wrote "The Prisoner of Zenda," which estublished his reputation. Subsequent books of his are "The Dolly Dialogues," "The God in the Car," "The Indiscretion of the Duchees," and at present he is engaged on a series of romantic stories, the scene of which is laid in an imaginary Italinn republic in the Middle Ages.
