Old Medal Plowed Up.
A Waterloo, Iowa, Jeweler has an interesting relic in the form of a medal cast in 1809 in commemoration of the consummation of a treaty of peace between certain Indian tribes of the Ohio valley and the United States. On one side the medal bears a bas-reIlef portrait of President Madison and the words: "James Madison, president of the United States, 1809." On the obverse there are symbolical devices, one being a pipe and tomahawk crossed, the pipe overlaying the weapon, indicative that peace is supreme over war. A pair of clasped hands are shown, the wrist of one hand being naked and the other showing the embroldered cuff of a soldier's coat sleeve. This particular medal was plowed up in Nebraska, and was about elght inches underneath the surface of the ground. It is of sllver.
