The W. T. M. will give a masque party to-night at the home of Mr. and Mrs. A. P. Mickey.

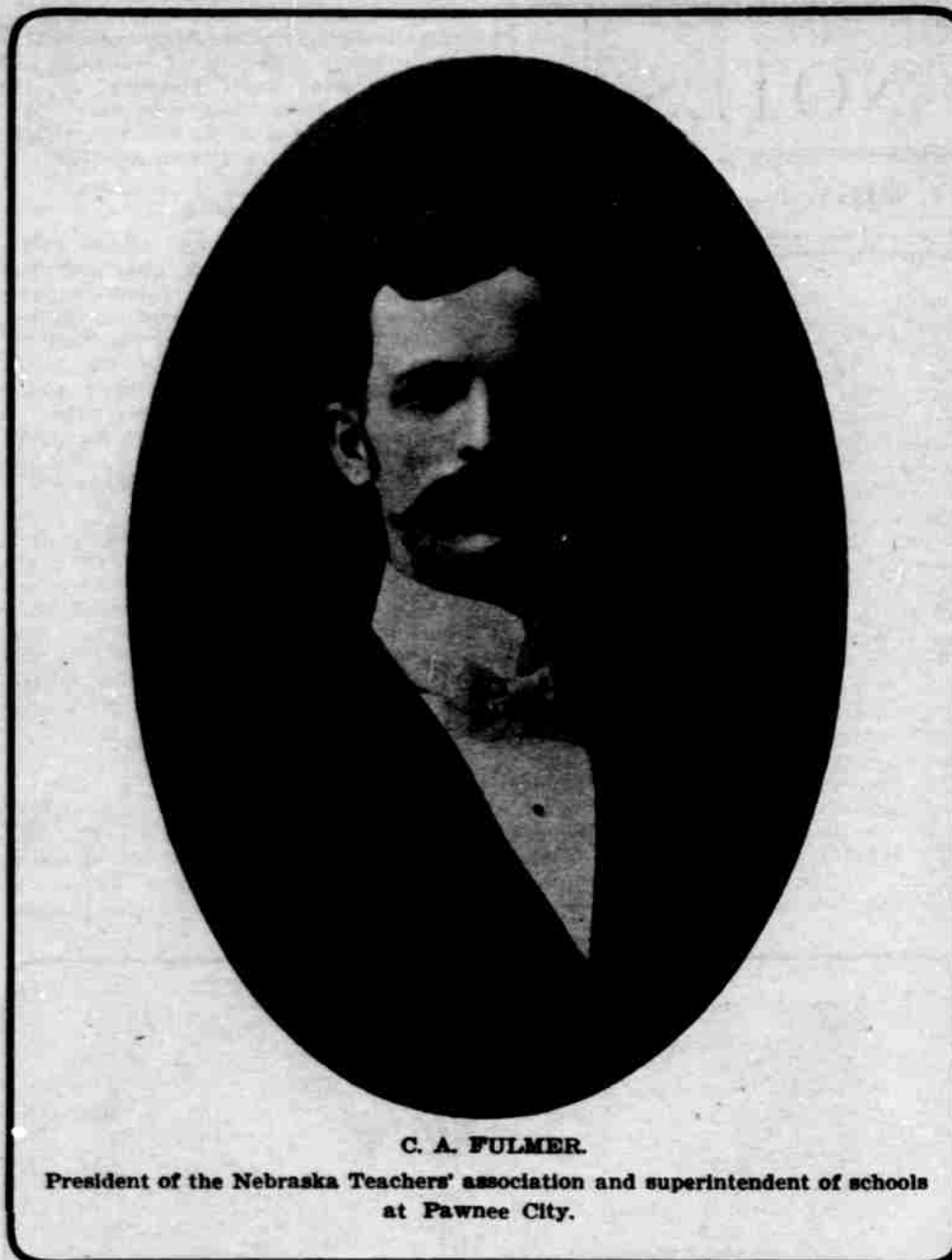
Mr. and Mrs. L. P. Sine will entertain the Nineteenth Century card club Tuesday evening.

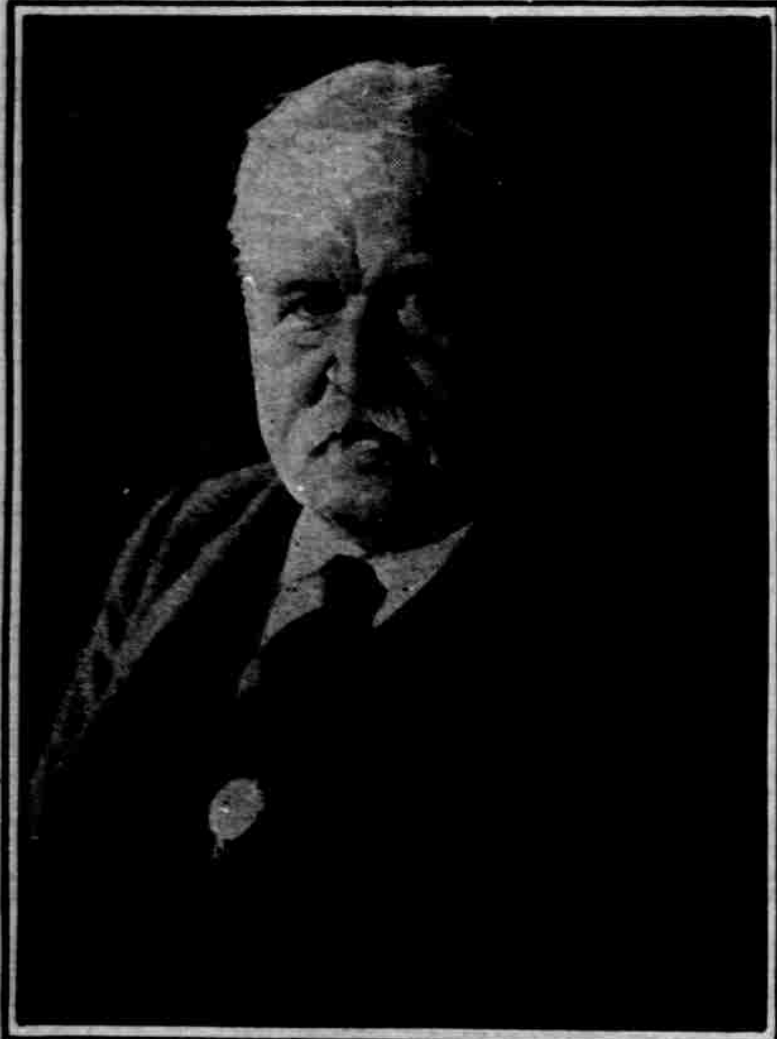
